

Sunday, April 12, is Divine Mercy Sunday. This is the conclusion and grand finale, properly speaking, of the great Solemnity of Easter. The Easter Season will extend on until Pentecost. Divine Mercy Sunday has its roots deeply planted in the Old and New Testament and in the early Church Tradition. It is a feast with three distinct dimensions, each emphasizing an aspect of the paschal mystery that needs to be brought out more clearly and appropriated by and for the faithful: merciful love, atonement, and covenant.

First, Divine Mercy Sunday focuses on God's mercy, and merciful love, as an event! It focuses on God's continuing action of mercy throughout salvation history as we see it recorded in the Letter to the Romans in chapters 9, 10, and 11, culminating in His loving plan to have mercy on all! (See Rom 11:32.)

Second, Divine Mercy Sunday focuses on our atonement for sins won for us and in us by Christ's suffering and death upon the Cross. It is this atonement by Christ that has been merited for us by the Passion of Christ for the sins of all persons (CCC 1992). It is this atonement that gives us hope in heaven.

Finally, Divine Mercy Sunday focuses on the Covenant of Mercy extended to us by Christ upon the Cross in His Body and Blood. On the octave day of Easter, we, too, ratify the Covenant of Mercy, reaffirming not only our Baptism - our new life in Christ, but also the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation and Eucharist – which sustain that life of Christ within us.

To celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, St Mary's will be hosting a Holy Hour of Adoration and Benediction on Sunday, April 12, from 2p-3p. Fr Gries will be available for confessions during this time. We will conclude with a recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet (texts will be provided) and Benediction. Please prayerfully consider putting this on your calendar to come and partake in Christ's infinite Mercy won for us by His Paschal Mystery in the Cross and Resurrection.
