

ON Tuesday, Nov 8, the nation will head to the polls to vote. In advance of the election, I would draw your attention to some guidance on voting from the US Bishops in Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: "Aided by the virtue of prudence in the exercise of well-formed consciences, Catholics are called to make practical judgments regarding good and evil choices in the political arena. There are some things we must never do, as individuals or as a society, because they are always incompatible with love of God and neighbor. Such actions are so deeply flawed

that they are always opposed to the authentic good of persons. These are called "intrinsically evil" actions. They must always be rejected and opposed and must never be supported or condoned... Catholics often face difficult choices about how to vote. This is why it is so important to vote according to a well-formed conscience that perceives the proper relationship among moral goods... When all candidates hold a position that promotes an intrinsically evil act, the conscientious voter faces a dilemma. The voter may decide to take the extraordinary step of not voting for any candidate or, after careful deliberation, may decide to vote for the candidate deemed less likely to advance such a morally flawed position and more likely to pursue other authentic human goods. In making these decisions, it is essential for Catholics to... recognize that all issues do not carry the same moral weight and that the moral obligation to oppose policies promoting intrinsically evil acts has a special claim on our consciences and our actions... political choices faced by citizens not only have an impact on general peace and prosperity but also may affect the individual's salvation" (FC 21, 22, 34, 36, 37, 38). A well-formed conscience utilizes the teachings of Christ and the Church as their central guide.

Next weekend, is Pledge Weekend for the annual Archdiocesan United Catholic Appeal. Please bring your completed appeal card to church to submit it. As in the past, I am always more interested in parish percentage of participation than the dollar amounts raised. If all have supported as they are able, then before God (and the archbishop), we will have done our best.
